Keynote Speakers

- [Loïc Berger](#) is a CNRS researcher at Lille Economics and Management (LEM) and the director of iRisk, a research center dedicated to risk and uncertainty. His research focuses on decision-making under uncertainty, particularly in climate economics.
- [Jean-Baptiste Fressoz](#) is a historian of science and the environment at CNRS and EHESS, specialized in the history of energy and resource exploitation. His work critically reassesses conventional narratives on energy transition, technology and environmental risks.
- [Stef Proost](#) is an Emeritus Professor at KU Leuven, specializing in environmental, energy, and transport economics. He has contributed to the development of several widely used economic models for EU policy analysis and has served as an expert for various European and international institutions in the fields of transport and energy policy.
- [Julia Steinberger](#) is a Professor of Ecological Economics at the University of Lausanne, where she investigates the relationship between resource use and societal well-being. She has served as a Lead Author for the IPCC's Sixth Assessment Report and since 2023, she has co-lead the EU-funded "REAL – A Post-Growth Deal" project.

- Main discipline of the communication
